

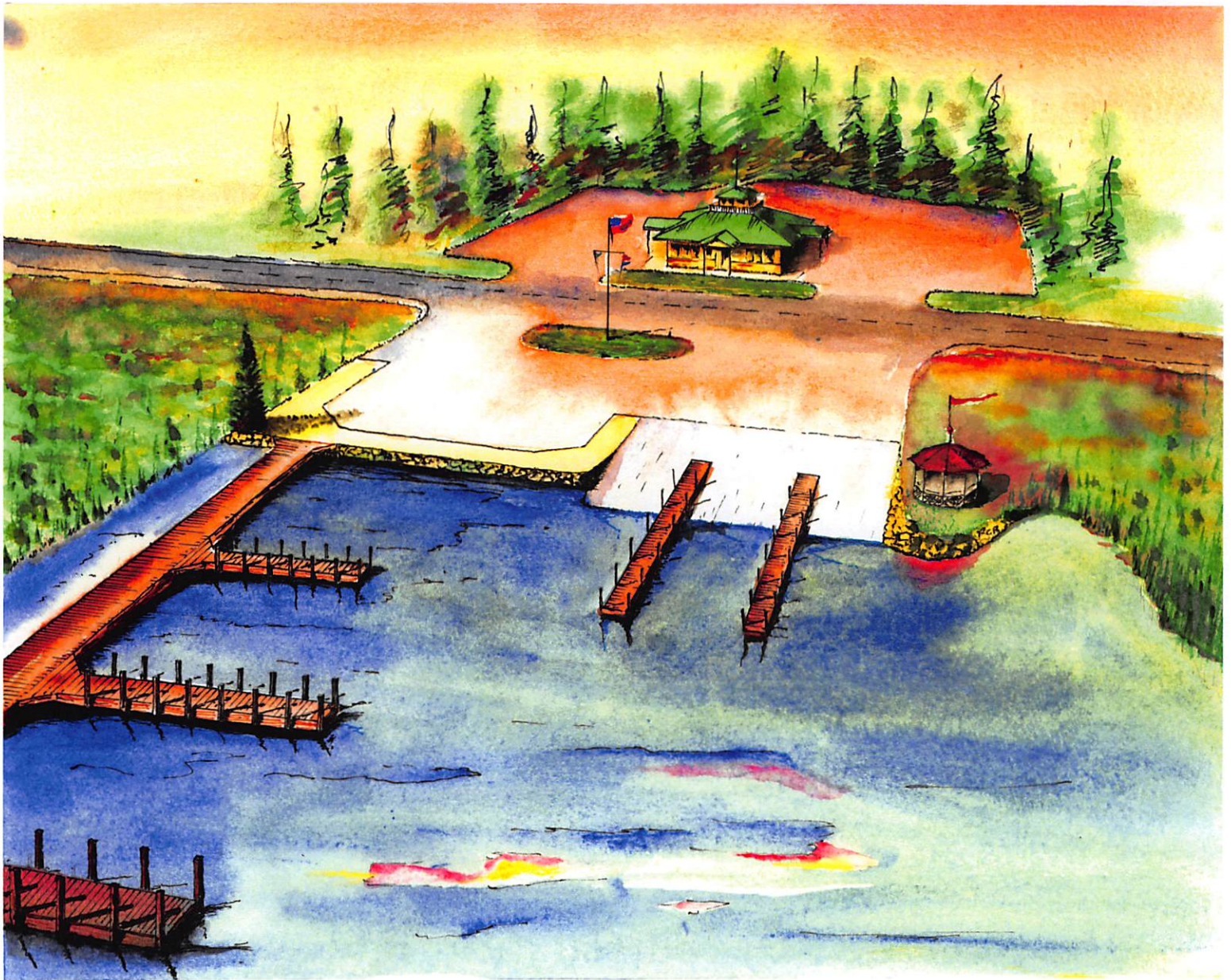
Cedarville Harbor Project

For the past several years, the Clark Township Board of Trustees has worked with representatives of the Watershed Council, Islands Association and representatives of the DNR Waterways Commission on plans to both upgrade the Cedarville launching ramp and to create transient docking accommodations.

The new facilities will provide much needed short term docking for local boaters and islanders to conveniently dock and run errands in a manner similar to Hessel, our sister village. This new asset is a Community effort to nurture the local economy and serves as a tangible example of revitalization efforts in downtown Cedarville as has been the case by the private sector with the new Distillery, and renovation of the former BlueWater Hotel as well as Kulpa's cabins on Hodeck Street.

This completed plan calls for major improvements on both the east and west side of Meridian Street. The east (water) side includes the installation of a 300 foot main pier, eight feet wide, with eight finger piers, each pier being six foot wide and of varied length to accommodate two boats on each side. The west side of Meridian Street will include a marina building with restrooms, showers, lounge and a marina office.

Total project cost is between \$950,000 and \$1,100,000. The good news is that two grants from the Waterways Commission and another Department of Natural Resources Trust Fund, plus local contributions from four groups, Clark Township, Watershed Council, The Island's Association and Les Cheneaux Lions Club, have reduced the local match to \$190,000 which is approximately 20% of the total cost. The Township Board has made it clear that for them to award bids, they must be assured that the local match is covered.

Everyone realizes this is a significant amount. However, if we wish to upgrade our local water amenities, for residents as well as community guests, this is a necessary project intended to revitalize the Cedarville waterfront.

The Les Cheneaux Community Foundation (LCCF) has agreed to serve as the fiduciary agent for local contributions. We are seeking your assistance in moving this project forward and ask that you send your tax-deductible contribution to LCCF at PO Box 249, Cedarville, 49719.

Attached is an artist's rendering of both the docking area and the marina building.



